3. Explain Atticus' view on people being equal.
4. What is unusual about how long it takes the jury to reach a verdict? Is the verdict predictable or not?
5. What events does Scout think of from earlier in the novel and how do they remind us of the novel's central themes?
6. Miss Maudie explains to Jem that "things are never as bad as they seem." What reasons does she give for this view?
7. Describe why Atticus defends Jem's, (and the other children's) right to know what has happened in the courtroom.
8. What do you think of Atticus' reaction to Bob Ewell's challenge?
