

**Complete the following questions related to novel/story elements:** **/10 (KU)**

1. Create a plot graph for the novel. Your plot graph must include the following parts: /5
  - a. Introduction
  - b. Inciting Incident
  - c. Rising Action (3-4 points)
  - d. Climax
  - e. Falling Action (2-3 points)
  - f. Conclusion/Resolution
  
2. Identify two themes for the novel, (i.e. lessons). Explain, with evidence from the novel, why you have chosen these two themes. /2
  
3. Prove that Scrooge is a *round* and *dynamic* character. Explain how he was at the beginning of the novel and the changes he underwent by the end. /2
  
4. What is Charles Dickens' definition of "Christmas spirit"? Support your answer using the novel. /1

**Choose one of the following assignments for the novel:** **/20 (APP)**

1. Create a comic strip of the novel in 5-7 cells (squares). Decide on the 5-7 most important "events" in the novel and illustrate them. Add speech bubbles and captions to explain what is going on for your audience. Add shading/colour/title to enhance your work.
  
2. Write a 1.5 page (using regular 11 or 12 point font) alternate ending of the novel where Scrooge's change comes "too late" and Tiny Tim dies. How does this affect the "new Scrooge" and what lessons might this
  
3. Write a review of the novel. In your review, ensure you specifically mention the different parts of the novel, (plot, conflict, characters) and whether or not they were clear to the reader and interesting. Talk specifically about Scrooge, such as how he changed, the lessons he learned, and the lessons that readers are supposed to pick up from the novel. Review each of the ghosts and the effectiveness of their roles. For all of that, make sure you provide clear examples from the novel. Conclude your review with a recommendation of the novel.
